



Creating a Book Recommendation Video

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Intended Grade Range: Grades 4 and up

Combining reading and technology may motivate students to pick up a book. By providing students the opportunity to film a book recommendation video, they will have something to look forward to once they finish reading. Creating videos in the classroom also can be an exciting way for students to hear recommendations from their classmates about what book they should read next. This resource provides sentence starters to help students think about points to address in their videos as well as special considerations for filming.

Filming Tips

- If you do not have access to a video camera or DSLR camera with video capabilities, most tablet or smartphone cameras can be used to produce HD videos suitable for posting online.
- Use a tripod if available. If not, assign another student to be the videographer and hold the camera as steady as possible.
- Set up the camera in a quiet place with minimal background noise.
- Do not film in front of a busy background as it can be distracting to the viewer.
- Speak loudly, clearly, and slowly.
- Have students hold up the book they are recommending during the video.
- Download videos from the camera shortly after completion to avoid accidental file loss.
- If you plan to post the videos on the web anywhere other than a school intranet, make sure you obtain permission from parents via a video release form.
- Have fun! Don't make it seem like students are reading from a script the entire time.
