



## Reading Relevance Log

The following is a reading log that students can use to keep track of the books they read and answer questions to reflect on whether or not they found the story interesting and relevant.

You can review students' responses to gauge the relevance of a particular text for your students. If students' responses indicate that they were able to connect with the story, you may choose to select other texts that are similar based on the characters, setting, or storyline. Research suggests when students read culturally relevant texts, they are more motivated and engaged with the text.
